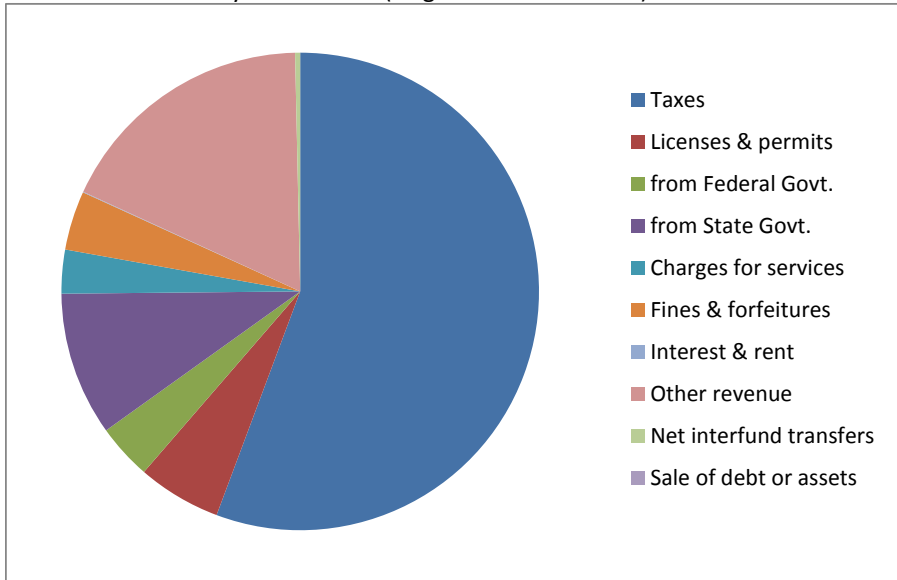


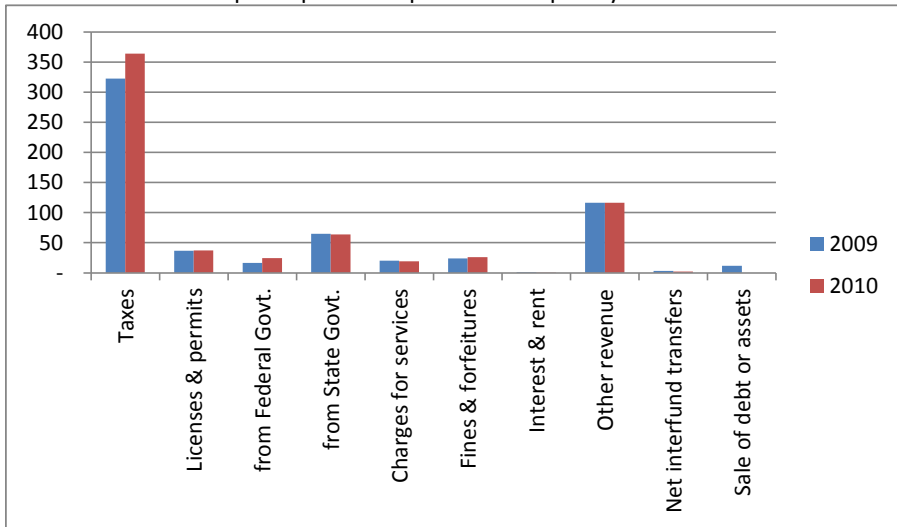
1. Where our money comes from (all governmental funds)



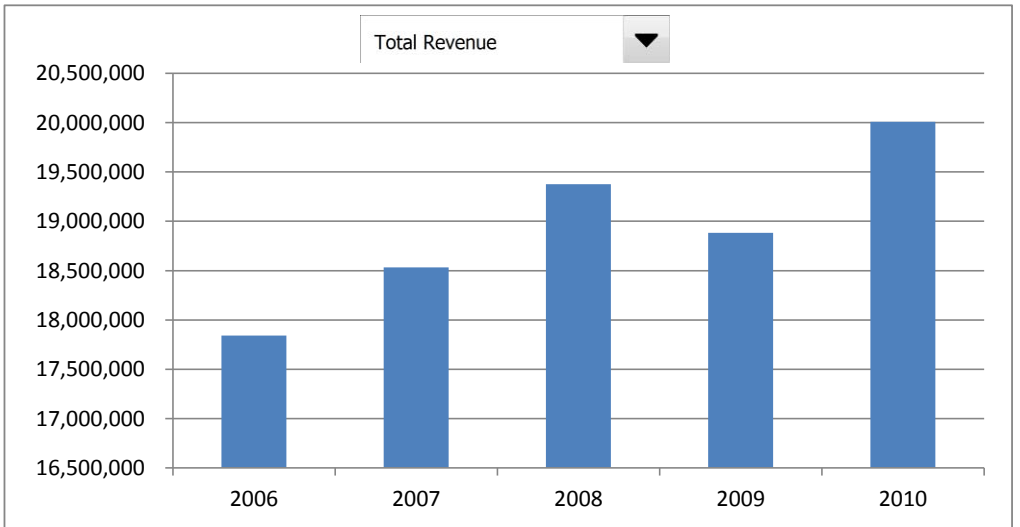

4. Historical trends of individual sources

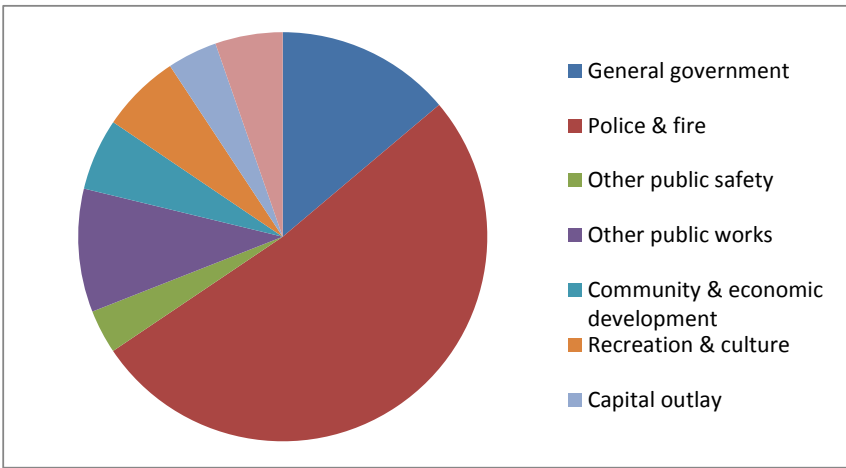


Commentary: The Township's total governmental revenue increased by approximately \$1,125,000, an increase of 6 percent. Property taxes increased by \$1,272,000, operating grants and contributions decreased by \$34,000, and investment earnings decreased by \$22,000. Capital grants and contributions increased by \$312,000.

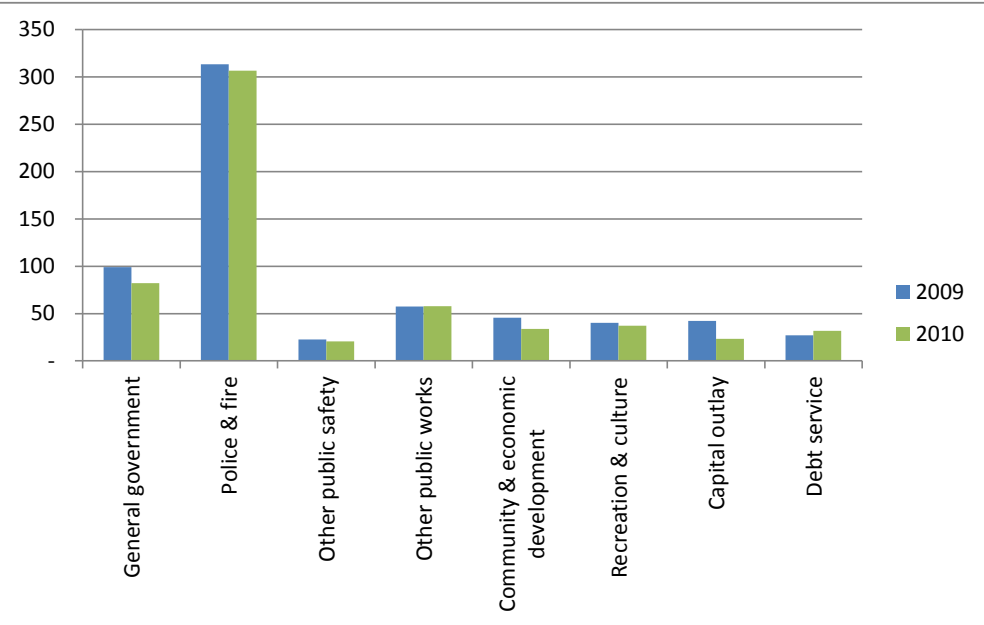

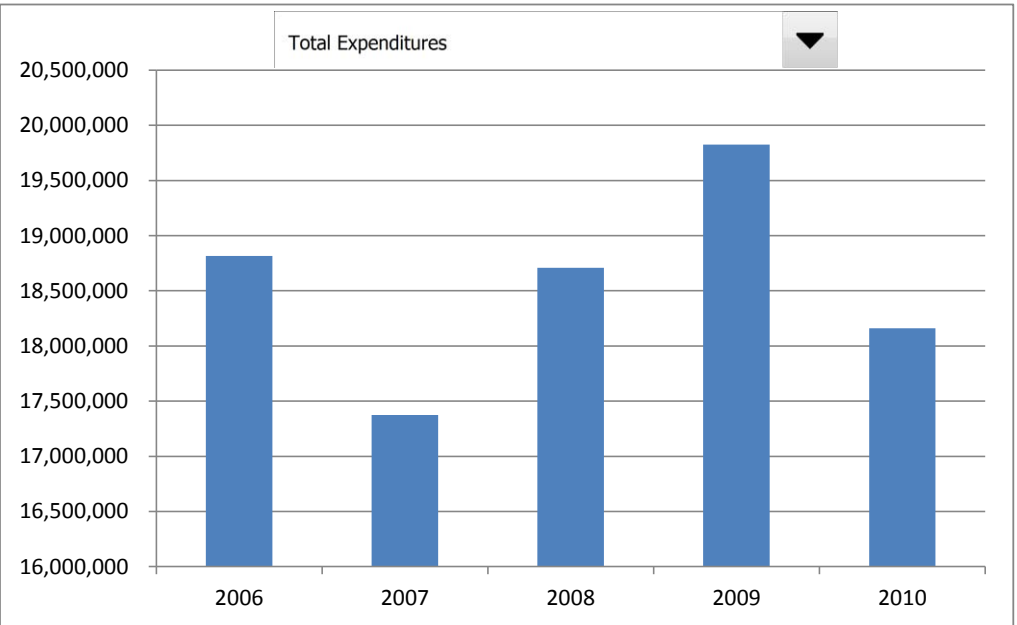

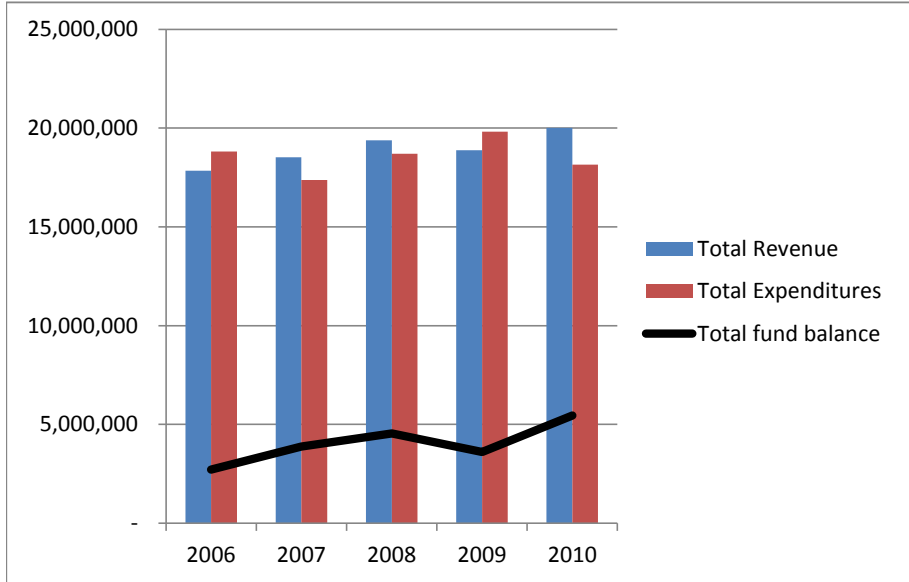

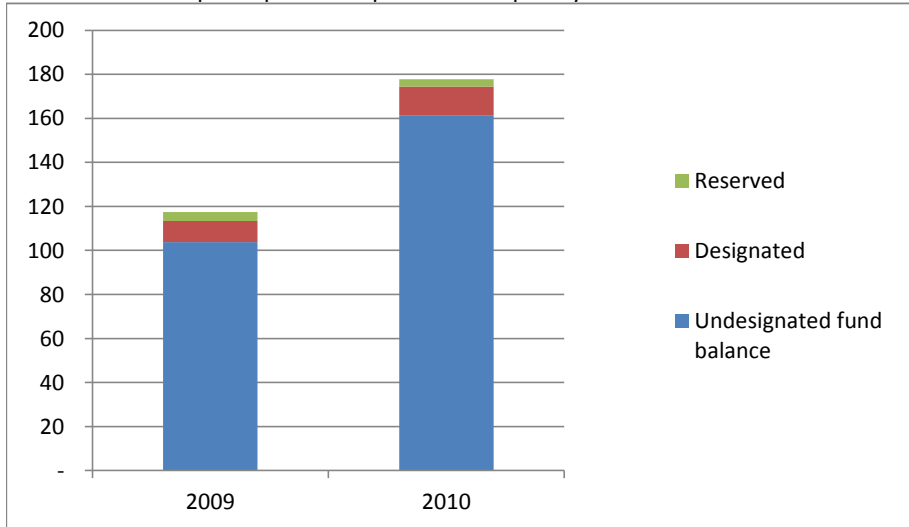
1. How have we managed our governmental fund resources (fund balance)?



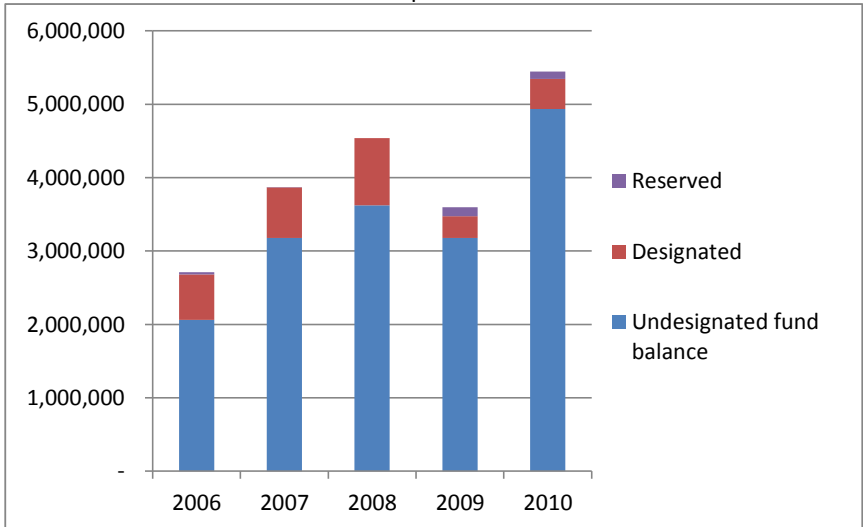

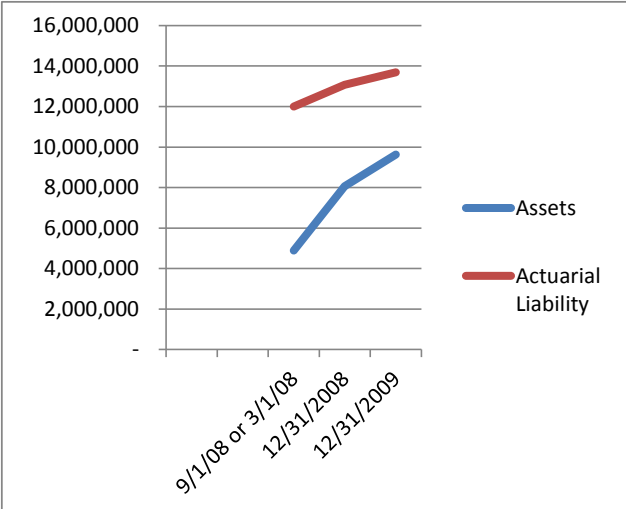


Commentary: The overall actual revenue and transfers were greater than expenditures and transfers; as a result, the General Fund's undesignated fund balance increased by over \$1 million.

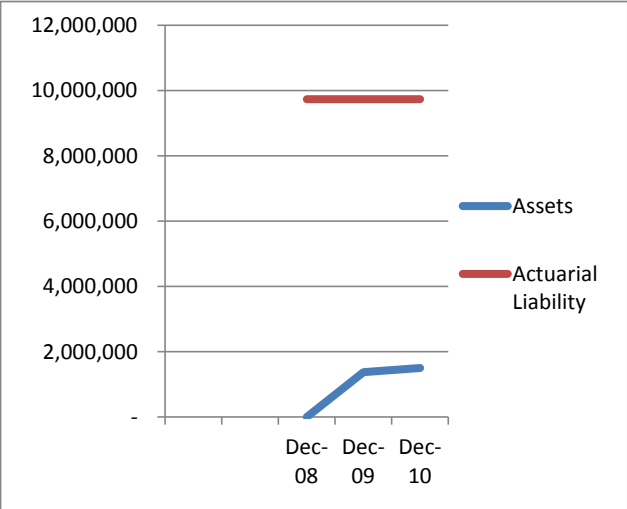

1. Pension funding status

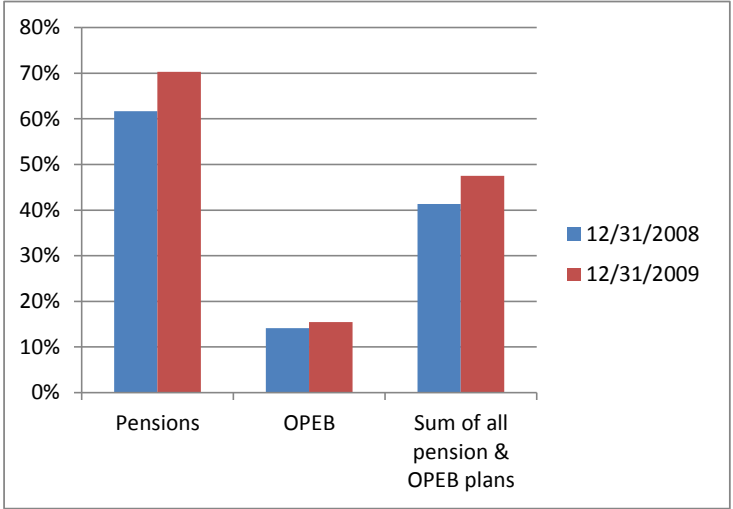


2. Retiree Health care funding status

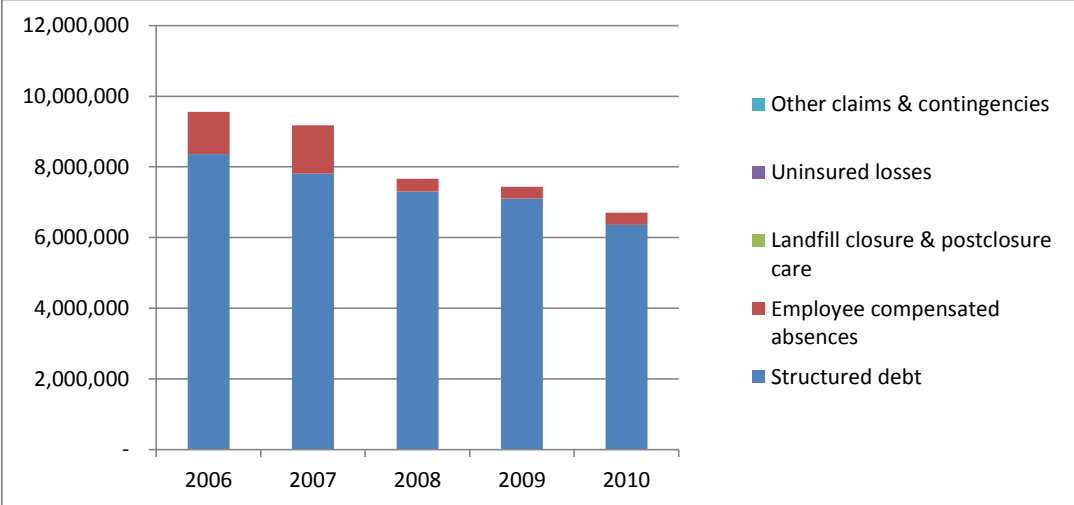

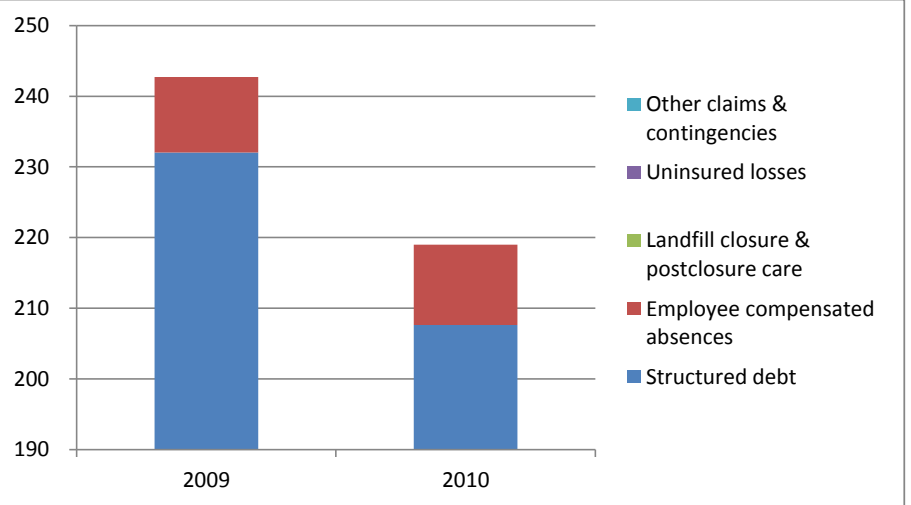
3. Percent funded - compared to the prior year

Commentary: During the year, the Township retired approximately \$2.6 million of debt. At the end of the year, the Township had \$6.4 million in bonds and notes outstanding for governmental-type activities compared to \$7.1 million at December 31, 2009.

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
